Compared with women whose husbands never smoked, women whose husbands smoked had an increased risk of COPD with an OR of 2.6 (90% CI 1.3 to 5.0) for husbands who smoked a pack per day or less and an OR of 1.5 (90% CI 0.8 to 2.7) for husbands who smoked more than a pack per day.
